

Moisture: Seedlings need consistent soil moisture, but don't let it get soggy.

Transplanting: Once the threat of frost risk wanes, transplant those robust seedlings outdoors for their stunning display.

Starting Outdoors

Opting for direct sowing? Here's how to sow Gaillardia seeds in your garden:

Timing: Wait until after the frost danger passes and the soil is workable.

Site Selection: Choose a sunny spot with well-draining soil: Gaillardia thrives in the sun!

Sowing Depth: Plant three seeds 1/4 inch deep in the prepared soil, covering them gently.

Spacing: Provide ample space of 12–18 inches between each trio to allow them to flourish.

Watering: Keep the soil moist until your vibrant Gaillardia seedlings emerge and establish themselves.

Thinning: Should the seedlings appear crowded, thin them out to give the strong ones room to thrive.

Mulching: A light layer of mulch helps retain moisture and curbs those persistent weeds.
